## Airport News

### May 1 - 7

- **Dining and Retail Changes**
  - Seattle Made in the C Concourse closed April 16 and will reopen as Hudson Nonstop.
  - New Stand in the N Concourse closed April 17 and will reopen as Emerald City Market. Temporary Hudson stand is open in the interim.
  - Baby Foodie vending machine in the A Concourse has been removed.
- **May Live Music Schedule** - Check out the lineup of live musicians at our airport!
- **International Society for Autism Research's (INSAR) International Meeting for Autism Research** - Next week, the Seattle Convention Center will welcome approximately 2,300 attendees to the International Society for Autism Research's (INSAR) International Meeting for Autism Research. Travelers for this conference may need additional support as well as needing Sunflower Lanyards.
  - **Primary Arrival Dates:** Tuesday, April 29th and Wednesday, April

30th

- **Main Departure Dates:** Saturday, May 3rd and Sunday, May 4th
- **Badging System Switch Over Announcement** - On May 12, the Port of Seattle will roll out a new badge system, Intellisoft IDMS. This will impact badges for all Aviation and Port locations, and you will see new badge designs starting May 12, 2025. During this transition period, the Credential Center and other Port badging location hours of operation, and services will be reduced. Check out the website for more **Credential Center Updates**.
- **Be REAL ID Ready for Travel** - Beginning on May 7, 2025, all travelers 18 years and older will need a state-issued REAL ID compliant license, identification card, or another type of photo ID accepted by TSA to fly within the United States. The big news is that your regular driver's license by itself isn't enough to verify your identity with TSA for air travel. **Here's what to know to avoid travel delays and disruptions.**

- **Checkpoint 1 Relocation**
  - Elevator B scheduled to reopen May 2.
- **Restroom Renovation**
  - The D11 restroom has reopened, which includes the family restrooms and drinking fountains.
- **SEA Gateway**
  - The suspended scaffolding above departures removal and ceiling finishes installation continues. Closures of north end of departures drive sidewalk and unloading lane are ongoing nightly between 11 p.m. and 5 a.m.
  - Terrazzo overlay work at Checkpoint 5 continues, which reduces queueing and temporarily closes screening lanes 5 and 6.
- **SEA Underground Controls**
  - Full shutdowns of the south loop (A/B/S stops) for 5 nights of bussing April 27- May 1 and May 4 - May 8 (11 p.m. - 2 a.m. and 4 a.m. - 5 a.m.).
- **Baggage Claim 15 and 16 Replacement**
  - Installation of construction walls and scaffold adjacent Claim 16 for a

new oversize bag drop begins May 5. Bag Claim 15 and 16 will remain in operation with reduced circulation space.

- **Maintenance**

- Closure of Men's/Women's/Family Restrooms, Baggage Level, Gina Marie Lindsey Hall between 10 p.m. - 4 a.m. Monday - Thursday nights (weekly through May 16)
- Elevator MT50 is out of service due to maintenance issues but is expected to return by the end of this week.
